COMPETITIONS

Many of the major competition results will be summarised below and as you will see; the results have been first class! Warringah has literally dominated many competitions, local and National. Countless personal best times, medals and awards have been won at all levels.

The 2023/24 season continued the Club's great form, and again ranks as one of the best years ever in the Club's history. One of the highest achieving Club's at SMNE, Metropolitan, State and National Age championships culminating in a fifth place at the 2023 National Age Championship point score was definitely the highlight of the year for the coaching staff as I am sure it would have been the same for swimmers and club members.

The Club was also very prevalent on the international scene, with both swimmer, Samuel Higgs, and coach, Cameron Gledhill gaining selection onto the 2023 Junior Australian Commonwealth Games Team.

Also to join the international brigade was younger brother Luke Higgs who was selected onto the Australian Junior Worlds Open Water Team which will compete in Italy later this year.

It is no wonder that the Club has such a significant profile throughout the country at present with such amazing results as mentioned and with the results listed below.

President's Report

It is with pleasure that I present my Report, highlighting another successful year for our club. The club has continued to thrive thanks to the hard work of our coaches, NS Swim School, the Committee, and naturally, the dedication and talent of our swimmers.

The Year in Review

The year began with the 2023 Age Nationals on the Gold Coast, where we had a record 38 Piranhas compete. Our swimmers earned an impressive 29 medals and ranked 5th in the country.

In June, eight of our athletes competed in Melbourne for the Australian World Trials. This event provided an incredible experience for our swimmers to compete at such a high level with many talented swimmers from across Australia. Our performances remained strong, finishing 3rd at the NSW SC Senior State Age in August 2023 and 11th at the NSW SC Junior State Age in September 2023.

The 2023-2024 Summer LC season kicked off with the Warringah LC Qualifying meet in October, where over 400 athletes from 15 clubs joined in the fun at our home pool, the WAC. It was a fun day with lots of prizes and numerous personal bests.

The season progressed to the SMNE long course, with 75 of our swimmers competing against nearly 600 swimmers from 13 clubs in the SMNE Area, keeping our coaches on their toes. Warringah finished 2nd in the medal tally with 21 gold, 18 silver, and 23 bronze medals, and 2nd in the point score behind the larger Knox Pymble team.

The week-long Senior State Age Championships in December saw 62 of our swimmers compete in 450 individual events and 23 relays in a heats and finals extravaganza. Our Piranhas came away with 24 gold, 15 silver, and 9 bronze medals, resulting in an overall 3rd place finish in the medal count and 4th place in the point score, with many personal bests and national times earned.

In January 2024, six of our toughest athletes and Coach Lachy traveled to Busselton, WA, to compete in the Australian Open Water Championships. Congratulations to Luke Higgs, who took first place honours in the 7.5k and 5k events, earning a spot on the Australian Junior team for the Junior World Championships in Italy later this year.

At the NSW State Open in March, 35 of our athletes competed in 110 individual events against the best from around Australia, almost like an Olympic Trials event. Their combined point scores totalled 207, placing Warringah in 16th place, our best position at an open level.

Our committee worked tirelessly throughout the year to run three swimming meets and club nights, which help fund the club's activities, particularly thanks to Ariel Darley. The support of these events is crucial for the club's financial viability and our ability to deliver services to our members. Thank you also to the Northern Beaches Council for providing time and pool space for these meets, and to our sponsor, IGA Allambie Heights, for supporting the meets with food for our officials.

Our members performed admirably across various water disciplines, including:

- Water Polo: Several members achieved representative status.
- Surf Life Saving: Many members competed, with several crowned as national champions at "the Aussies" 2023.

The Strength of a Club is its People and Culture

While our achievements in the pool are a result of hard training, the real strength of the Club is our people. We constantly receive feedback from other clubs about our team spirit and sportsmanship.

This year brought changes, as coaches moved on, which is a natural part of every sport. We were fortunate to have Cam, Lachie, and Sandi doing such a great job over the past few years. We are equally lucky to have Angelo, Cam (new Cam), and Frank to replace them. Angelo has already shown his skill, experience, and expertise as our head coach, and we anticipate great things to come.

Swimming is a tough sport, and we must always support our teammates in their pursuits. It is our teamwork at Warringah Aquatic that determines our performance as a club and as individuals.

Our club's culture continues to foster growth, and at the close of the financial year, we had 214 members (prior year 263 members) with 141 competitive swimmers (prior year 163 competitive swimmers). We are a place where swimmers want to train, compete, and be part of our Piranha community.

Angelo and the Club will continue to focus on retaining the Piranhas in the Open competitor arena and competing at national and international levels. The establishment of an open program is just the beginning.

The committee and coaching staff have a plan that focuses on:

- The club's vision: To be the performance program for Northern Beaches.
- Protecting our culture: As a community club where every member matters and feels valued.
- Retaining our national age swimmers: Transitioning them to Open swimming to be competitive at national and international levels across all age groups.
- Supporting member wellbeing: Physically and mentally, in and out of the pool.
- Providing a welcoming environment: For swimmers of all levels to swim, stay fit, and compete at their desired level.



Treasurer's Report

First, I would like to thank my fellow Committee Members for their support and the unpaid hours each commits to this club. I would also like to thank all members who contributed their time to running our Meets. It is these events which are a major contributor to our income (other than membership) and crucial to the club's success and financial status.

As at 31st March 2024 the club has cash at Bank of \$31,433.75 (Transaction Account). PayPal Account as at 31st March 2024 held \$15,771.54. Total cash holdings equal \$47,205.29. No liabilities were recorded as at the same date.

Current inventory was valued at \$13,025.87 listed as part of Current Assets.

Inventory has increased with purchasing of new clothing stock "on hand" to meet member requirements.

Currently WASC has committed for the next twelve months to pay Head Coach Angelo Basalo a retainer of \$1,250.00 per month.





Discussions in relation to Lachlan and Sandi's replacements will be addressed by the Executive and funds made available if required.

This coaching retainer is currently the only future liability that WASC has going forward and WASC will continue funding opportunities for members deemed financially viable by the Executive Committee.

I am pleased to report after key income and expense items are taken into account, the final position as at 31st March 2024 was a Net profit of \$17,130.09*

Registrar's Report

During the 2023–2024 season, we experienced a small decrease in membership, with our numbers decreasing by 49, bringing our total membership to 214.

At 31 March 2024, our club had 141 full swimmers, 55 dry members, 10 club only swimmers, and 8 life members.

Full swimming memberships split into the following age categories:

- 18-26yrs: 9
- 15-17yrs: 48
- 13-14yrs: 38
- 8-12yrs: 46

Our largest membership category is the 15-17 yrs group, consisting of 48 swimmers, comparing to last year being 47 swimmers.

We've seen a minor decrease in numbers in:

- 8-12 yrs by 8 swimmers,
- 13-14 yrs by 9 swimmers,
- 16-26 yrs by 7 swimmers.

Our Club has continued to support our swimmers and maintain a high standard of training and participation in National, State and Area events.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all our volunteers for the unwavering support and dedication. The efforts that go in to ensuring the success and smooth functioning of our Club are a direct result of your hard work and enthusiasm, so thank you!
